Here is a principle of sowing into another ministry or work. **"Give, and it shall be given unto you" starts the flow of God's abundance "one free will gift" at a time.**

The world promotes fear and uncertainty in our lives when we look at giving, but our Abba is committed to bless and prosper us.

The farmer has to prepare the soil, plant the seeds in order to get a crop. But God created natural laws that govern sowing and reaping.
